Shirehampton Action is the New Name for SCAF

Shirehampton Community Action Forum has been running for over 20 years with Ash Bearman being their Community Development Officer and main contact for the local community, especially with the activities they run in the area.

The organisation is taking on a new name -Shirehampton Action - and I spoke with two of the Trustees, Michelle Sylvestre, Chair Person and Ludo Tolu, Treasurer. I was intrigued by the name change:

"We want to motivate people around the purpose of our organisation, to take meaningful action to improve Shirehampton for everyone who lives, works, or plays here. We're proud of the work we've done over the past couple of decades but wanted to be more recognisable with a clearer name, logo and increasing online presence. In 2025 we will be launching an updated community plan, which incorporates a community climate and nature plan. We want to engage with more people and to join us in improving Shirehampton for everyone. So this was the right moment to change." said Ludo

"We offer opportunities to raise concerns and discuss solutions at our action groups that cover planning, community safety, road safety and climate

emergency. You can also get involved with nature through our bulb planting, pollinator and gardening projects, and monthly litter picking. There is the chance to meet others at the weekly Community Living Room, Walking Groups, Door to Door Shopping Trips and the Star Bereavement Group. We also organise local events including markets, fayres, and Shire's first ever LGBT+ pride event last July and hope to repeat this year." added Ludo

I asked Michelle how Shirehampton Action will embrace intergenerational activities for all generations, disabilities and cultural traditions?

"We strive to make our events accessible for the people who live in Shirehampton. If you need BSL interpretation, translation from another language, or have other specific access needs we'd encourage you to speak to Ash about how to make a specific event or activity accessible to you. We hold events at wheelchair accessible venues and typically close to or on the Shirehampton high street. All events to date



have been free to access. There is always more we can do to improve the range of events on offer to inspire different people, families and young people. We would welcome and support ideas, as well as volunteers from all backgrounds, with a range of skills and knowledge to join us and get involved with the activities we run too".

"Shirehampton Action could not continue without funding, sponsorship or donations for which we appreciate and our minimum funding target for this vear is £30,000 which will allow us to continue our current range of activities. If we can double that we will be able to do a whole lot more and start some of our climate projects sooner." said Michelle.

With a new web site being launched in January www.shirehamptonaction.org.uk Shirehampton Action would also like to thank **Direct Local**, **Bob** Pitchford and Sonia Grogneuf for their assistance.



An Update from Darren Jones MP, Bristol North West

My family and I would like to wish you all a Happy New Year!

Ringing in the new year makes us reflect on the one that has just ended. 2024 was certainly a momentous year that I will never forget – another General Election and being asked by the Prime Minister to be a cabinet minister.

More importantly, this time of year makes us plan for our hopes and goals for the coming year. With this in mind, I'm holding a **Town Hall event** on **Saturday, 18th January** in Henleaze for a forward-looking discussion about the **climate crisis** with constituents from across **Bristol North West**.

As always, the audience will decide the topics to be discussed, but the recent COP29 conference will be on the agenda, with an invited speaker sharing the outcomes from this international climate conference.

On a related topic, in November, **Viridor** wrote to me to announce its decision to close its UK plastics reprocessing site in Avonmouth at the end of the year because recycling rates are below what they were projected to be. Given the site only opened in March 2022, I know this news has come as a surprise to many people. At the time of writing, Viridor said it is still undergoing a consultation process for the 120 employees at the site, and I have been informed that 14 of the employees are constituents who live in **Avonmouth, Shire** and **Lawrence Weston**.

This would always be difficult news to hear, let alone coming in the lead up to Christmas. I sincerely hope that many workers can be redeployed to other parts of the Viridor business. (Its other facility at Avonmouth, which incinerates non-recyclable household waste that would otherwise end up in a landfill, will remain open. I've been reassured that plastics that would have recycled at the Avonmouth site will be sent elsewhere rather than incinerated, though.) Bristol has had the highest recycling rate among English 'core cities' for eight consecutive years but we know that recycling rates are too low across the UK and that we must improve our use of resources. Even here in Bristol, we see recycling rates stubbornly stagnating. Around 45% of waste in Bristol is recycled, which is good compared to other areas, but we can all do more. That's why this government is committed to delivering on packaging reforms and a transition to a 'circular economy' moving away from the current unsustainable 'take, make, and throw' economic model, and replacing it with the principles of 'reduce, reuse, and recycle'.



If you're keen to find out more about a circular economy, I'll be happy to answer your questions at the Town Hall. And, yes, there'll also be an opportunity to discuss the draft proposals reportedly being considered by **Bristol City Council** to reduce the frequency of general waste and recycling bin collections (which seems like a daft idea to me).

We were inspired by COP26 held in Glasgow in 2021. People from Shirehampton joined a march all the way to Glasgow to support the conference which aimed to keep global warming to 1.5C.

had Storm Burt and Storm Darragh with truly destructive winds and devastating floods. We see that climate change is underway and accelerating. We know our homes and infrastructure are increasingly at risk yet we seem unable to do what is necessary: stop fossil fuel emissions.

So as I look forward to 2025 I ask myself 'What can I do to live well with the consequences of climate change?'

In 2024 the world exceeded the 1.5 limit. We In December I wrote about a workshop imagining a future for ourselves as our climate changes. We thought a lot about local, communal ways of living, sharing local resources and organizing local government. Whether we knew it or not, we were imagining living by a whole new set of values caring for one another, respecting and caring for our local environment and all the creatures in it, taking only what we needed to live healthy joyful lives. I think we see hopeful signs of our community living these values for example, in local responses to



storm damage, in the many warm and welcoming communal spaces available, in projects like the Repair Cafes which support more sustainable living and the communal gardens and green spaces which encourage biodiversity.

Starting in January there will be a Talking Corner at the Repair Cafe where we can explore our climate anxiety - what it's like to feel powerless in the face of climate breakdown - and talk more about what we all can do to live well with whatever happens. We can all support each other!







Football's Coming Home; Shirehampton F.C. Return to Penpole Lane

On Tuesday 3rd December, Shirehampton played what it was hoped would be their final game at Manor Farm. The floodlight installation at Penpole Lane had been completed on the previous day, but not "signed off" in time for this match.

It can become a rat-run, an easy escape route, in which wee anticipate and manage a loss we fear by concocting a story; we can embrace defeat itself and give ourselves credit for being a good loser, accept flattery from the victor as some sort of compensation or simply make up

The worst aspect of narrative is that it ties into hope. That may sound strange. One should always surely have hope? But that sort of hope is better termed courage; it's the willingness to do one's best, no matter the odds. The hope that isn't useful in sport is the hope of desperation. Desperation has its place. The classic situation occurred in the bronze medal match of the Women's Sabre event of the recent Paris Olympics; a young Korean fencer met the multiple times World Champion, Olga Kharlan of Ukraine. Kharlan was the crowd favourite



and expected to win. She started aggressively but inattentively, lost in the narrative of bringing glory to her country and achieving part of her fairy tale. She rushed and was hit, ending the first period of fencing well behind. At the break her coach gave her a talking to. Kharlan came out a different fencer. The Korean could have realised the change and fenced Kharlan on her merits, with the advantage of a lead. Instead she kept on trying to punish the fault Kharlan was no longer doing. The Korean had slipped into hope; the hope that Kharlan would revert to carelessness, the hope that the few points required come her way to get to the fifteen required.

We don't engage with the moment when we hope. One trick is to view each action in a match as a cell of a comic strip and ignoring how we got there, just sensing what can be done from there, in that moment.

Sport is that interplay of developed skill, fault/opportunity recognition and review. Hoping gives us none of those. It's courage gets us through.

Proposed New Cycle Hub

Share your views on the council's proposals for a flagship cycling facility in Lawrence Weston and Shirehampton on the Merrimans and Henacre Open Space next to the BMX track.

The state-of-the-art Bristol Regional Cycling Hub would be open all year round and aimed at people of all ages and cycling abilities from across the West of England.

- a two-storey building with offices, public toilets and rooms to hire
- a car park with EV charging points
- a public footpath around the site
- an upgrade of the National Cycle Network

On top of offering a variety of cycling tracks and spaces to learn, train and compete, Bristol Regional Cycling Hub would provide jobs, volunteering opportunities, community spaces and bike maintenance.

Councillor Ed Plowden, Chair of the Transport and Connectivity Committee, said: "We're keen to find out how people would use the proposed cycling hub and want to hear from residents in the surrounding area as well as those across Bristol.

"This is an opportunity to build a fantastic trafficfree environment dedicated to cycling. We would use it to offer targeted active travel and health programmes, road safety training for all, and a fun space to cycle for sport and health from beginners right through to experienced cycling competitors.


