REMEMBRANCE: Remembering D-Day

November 10th saw Remembrance Sunday at Shirehampton Cenotaph very well supported by the local communities and wreaths were greater in number. The local Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, Cubs, Scouts, Avonmouth Sea Cadets and Fire Brigade were out in force. Military veterans remembered friends lost in later conflicts as well as those who went before them. One hymn sung hit technical problems and with no music everyone carried through the song to the end.



This year marked the 80th Anniversary of D-Day, a turning point in WWII for the Allies. Known as **Operation Overlord**, allied forces launched a combined naval, air and land assault on the **Normandy** beaches opening a long and costly campaign to liberate **Northern Europe** from **German** occupation. Primarily American, British and Canadian forces, Australian, Dutch, French, Czech, Polish, Norwegian, Rhodesian, Belgian, New Zealand and Greek forces were in support. Shortly after midnight on **6th June** the invasion of **France** began.

My Uncle, **Tom O'Neill**, was one of those who made it to the beaches at 8am that morning. The following extract from an interview I did with him in 2014 has the blessing of his family, my cousins, to print.

"I was called up on **14th December 1943** at the age of eighteen by the army in the first instance. Then *Continues on page 8.*







Continued from page 1.

I was told I was going into the navy and ended up as an SBA, Sick Birth Attendant, which was regarded as a nurse. A three year training course was condensed into an intensive six months. On the 30th May we finished our training and on the 31st May thirteen of us were called together. We were taken to Portsmouth Harbour. We were put aboard the motor boat, taken to first 4 and 6 landing ship tanks. It was all top secret - we didn't know. All we knew was that we were part of the second front".

"What I remember about D-Day was the noise of the shells from the battle ships, the depth charges being dropped to keep the submarines away, the torpedo boats speeding in and out looking out for enemy boats. On the top deck of our ship I could see the hundreds of small invasion craft carrying troops and watching the troops go onto the beach." "Our first trip was equipment to build a runway within 12 hours to allow gliders to land. Other trips included tanks that could go on land and sea. We had thirty docks that could go on land and carry troops and we had ambulances on the deck too. Once the equipment was dropped off we had to go down and prepare for the wounded to come on board, all nationalities, stretchered patients, many unconscious, walking wounded, up to 550 at any one time. We'd go back to England, discharge the patients to hospital then load up with more equipment. I remember on 19th June we were shelled whilst moving patients from a cargo ship where they lost two crew members. For me it was my job."

"There's no glory in war and if you can work together, remain part of Europe, we stand a better chance of things turning out better for us all. It is important to remember people, especially the sacrifices that were made by many".

Continental Polish Shop

Marta Pokorska is the Store Manager of the Continental Polish Shop and has been part of our High Street for almost thirteen years. It is an Aladdin's cave of lovely food which is a favourite with a friend mine who stocks up with food items when he visits me.



Being part of the **Food Plus group**, it's owner **Konrad** wanted a place where the **Polish community** could buy, talk in their native language and feel like home as well as introducing Polish products to local communities giving them chance to try something different.

I asked Marta to describe a typical day to me. "We start the day with fresh bread delivered from our Polish bakery in Bristol. There is the morning rush from parents who pop in after the school run buying essentials and favourites. Throughout the day we continue serving our customers which is a priority and we make sure all our shelves are well stocked." As for what she liked most about her job Marta continued "I like to meet and talk with all our customers who are like family here. I want to make them feel happy with what we sell as well as trying out new products and discovering new tastes."

The shop remains busy and I ask Marta why she thinks it's popular. "The shop is full of products from Poland that are different and unique. Biebrzowka is Polish smoked ham, crispy and full of flavour which is a favourite along with our apples and tomatoes which come from Poland that have a different flavour. Our Polish traditional cakes are popular and are perfect with coffee or tea. We also want to make our customers feel welcome and help them where I can."

Asking about the future of the High Street Marta said. "We are small businesses and need the community to continue to support us and shop local. We talk with our customers and get to know them. We need to stick together, help each other and keep our streets safe for everyone."

An Update from Darren Jones MP used for small changes in law - and legalising **Bristol North West**

In mid-October, the journalist Lucy McDaid from ITV West Country joined me on a visit to my former school, Oasis Academy Brightstowe (known as Portway School back then), where I delivered my first public speaking masterclass for students of the new academic year. The students were clearly engaged and eager to learn - they'd even sacrificed an inset day to attend! - but most were a bit shy and nervous to talk to me.

The journalist was worried the TV camera was making the students clam up, but I had a similar experience when I delivered the masterclass in the school last year, and when I've visited many of our other state schools, too. But that's why these sessions are important - we need children from all backgrounds to be confident public speakers if we're ever going to smash the class ceiling. Now, I always try my best to keep you informed of upcoming events in this column, but sometimes an event is arranged at short notice that falls between issues. That's what happened with my Assisted Dying Town Hall, which needed to be held before a vote in the House of Commons on 29th November on whether to legalise assisted death.

I hope that many of you managed to hear about it from other means. But in case you missed it, I wanted to briefly outline my position here, as I know how emotive an issue this is across our communities in Bristol, with strong feelings on both sides of the debate.


My view is that a Private Members' Bill is not the right way to try to introduce a change in law on such a complex issue. Private Members' Bills, which are introduced by backbench MPs, don't get anywhere near the same level of scrutiny and debate as the bills put forward by the Government. As someone who has passed a Private Members' Bill in the last Parliament, I am aware that they are normally only

assisted death does not fall under that category. I therefore plan to either abstain or vote against the Bill on these grounds. If you're interested in this debate, please feel free to contact me for a full policy response.

River Soundings: A Hopeful Future?

"We cannot create what we can't imagine" (Lucille Clifton)

Shirehampton Climate Emergency Group hosted an immersive sound workshop, River Soundings, in November. The workshop asked us to imagine what the future of our river might be as the climate changes over time. What would the river be like and what kind of community would we like Shirehampton to become as we adapt to the effects of climate change? Though it was a mizzly, dim and murky November afternoon we were asked to imagine positive and hopeful futures because *"we cannot create what we can't imagine"*.



We were asked to spend a few minutes beside the river recording our ideas and feelings which were then woven into a soundscape incorporating all our dreams for our future. Despite the gloomy day our imagined future river was clean and sunny, its quality automatically monitored by our community owned water company. Our local **Citizen's Assembly** had decided to build a footbridge from the **Portway to Pill** so people had easy access to allotments and communal vegetable farms on both sides of the river. We knew that many familiar trees and plants hadn't survived the extremes of weather we'd been having, but we saw that new species taking their place were also beautiful. There were many birds of all kinds and our heronry had survived!

What struck me most listening to all these dreams for the future was that all of them imagined a much more simple, communal way of life where everyone shared what they had; where everyone respected and cared for the natural world – for trees and grasses, butterflies and slow worms; where we joined together to decide how to use our resources for the good of everyone. Our river, our water, our wind, our sunshine provided all the energy we needed. There was no fossil fuel polluting our future.







News from ShireStrong Kettlebell Club

The ShireStrong Kettlebell Club, a dedicated community of fitness enthusiasts, gathers three times weekly to build strength and endurance through kettlebell training. Fencing Rules

In many human conventions, whether an art, a science or a sport, what's left out is as important as what's kept in. My sport, like all others, has rules and rules principally tell us what's excluded and within them we can do pretty much what we like.

Fencing is a game made from fighting - and even the fighting, back then, had rules - but they leave a lot out.

One obvious thing left out is physical danger: the weapons aren't sharp and the kit keeps us safe from them.

In two of the three forms of the sport, foil and sabre, the rules also determine who scores when both hit. That's because leaving out a part changes the whole. With a blade heading for my heart, I probably wouldn't just say to myself, I'll take him down with me; I'd try to defend myself. In foil and sabre if I ignore a threat that hits home, my own hit won't score.


That's a relic of when fencing masters taught soldiers and duellists the art of de*fence* but it also makes for a more interesting game. Epee fencing also has rules but they're more of the type found in boxing: no gouging or biting, etc - though biting isn't really possible while wearing a fencing mask.

The rules, like the principles of self-preservation they were designed to replace, become second nature, like the rules of the road, just as the actions that work become like a second language when we fence.

Rules, clearly stated, understood and fairly enforced make the game exciting, rewarding and fun.

At this, of all times, we know war is pure horror but just as football evolved by rules from the village against village brawl of the bonspiel, fencing keeps the skill and excitement of combat, without the misery, pain and loss.
