Shirehampton Library 120 Years Not Out... Yet!

On 6th March 2025 we celebrate 120 years since Shirehampton Library was opened to the public. With so many of those years marked by battles to keep the doors open, is it still worth fighting for in 2025?



When the population of Shirehampton village surged in the early 20th century, due to the new Avonmouth docks, it was widely acknowledged that the masses needed "a focal point". Squire Napier Miles of Kingsweston donated land along Station Road, originally called 'Ash Paddock'. Architect, Frederick Bligh Bond was appointed to design a building which would accommodate 500 people for cultural events, 'retiring rooms' and a public library.

These plans were revised after 6 months with an enlarged library. £800 had been donated by the American/Scottish businessman and philanthropist

Andrew Carnegie for a 'centre of light and learning' in Shirehampton. Over 2500 'Carnegie Libraries' were opened around this time, all over the world. Our own was to be run and maintained by Bristol Public Libraries. Carnegie's view was that "no millionaire will go wrong... who chooses to establish a free library in any community that is willing to maintain and develop it."

Over the last 120 years it certainly has been an immeasurable asset to the local community and has been developed in ways Carnegie and Napier Miles could never have imagined. Reading the reminiscences of readers and staff (which can be found in the library itself) you get a sense of a space which has acted like a magnet, drawing people from both the isolation and daily hubbub of their own homes, into a space of order, peace, friendly community and the endless possibilities for escapism, imagination and self-improvement that a library offers.



An Update from Darren Jones MP, Bristol North West

At the start of February, as our first Prime Minister to join a meeting of European Council members since Brexit, Keir Starmer has started the much-needed work to rebuild the UK's relationship with Europe.

On **19th May**, the UK will welcome the **Presidents of the European Council** and the **European Commission** to the UK for the first UK-EU leaders' summit, to further strengthen the relationship between the UK and the EU.

And in **June**, I'm organising a summit in Bristol North West specially for constituents on *Resetting our relationship with the EU*'.

The latter is part of a new series of town hall events that I'm running across the constituency this year before the summer recess, with each event themed to focus on a different mission in this government's **Plan for Change**. And you'll be pleased to hear that one of the town halls will be held in Shire!

I'm holding these events because it's important that, in my capacity as a constituency MP, I hear your views on the government's plans. This is your opportunity to share with me your support, questions or concerns about the work that my Cabinet colleagues and I are doing to deliver on our promise of change. I've already got the ball rolling on this new series of events by discussing the UK's transition to clean energy at a packed **Climate Crisis Town Hall** in **Henleaze** in January.

Next up, I'll be holding a town hall in **Southmead** on Saturday, 1st March (2:30pm-4:00pm) to discuss our government's mission to build 1.5 million new homes in England and fast-track planning decisions.

Whilst this drive to find new sites for house building won't affect Bristol North West, in the local context, a housing development in **Lawrence Weston** with existing planning permission will be breaking ground in a few months' time. And work on the **YTL Arena** and neighbouring **Brabazon housing development** is already underway – along with new train stations for the **Henbury line** and somewhat controversial plans to add bus and cycle lanes in Henbury and Brentry in the works, all in a bid to prevent congestion from the builds.

The town hall in Shire, which is anticipated to be held on **Saturday, 26th April**, will focus on the mission



to put 13,000 more police officers on the beat and to have a named officer for every neighbourhood. Most of us have experienced a rise in Anti-Social Behaviour in the village over the past couple of years, so I would greatly value your participation in this event. Everyone should feel safe in their own home and within their community.

Tickets for the event in Southmead are available to book now at **darren-jones.co.uk/events**, or by calling my office on **0117 959 6545** if you don't have internet access. Tickets for the other events will be released in due course – please sign up to my monthly newsletter on my website to be among the first to hear when the events are available to book. (The event in Shire might be available to book by the time you read this, so it's worth checking!)

Autumn Years Dementia Respite Group at Lawrence Weston Community Farm

"The disease might hide the person underneath, but there's still a person in there who needs your love and attention".

On Monday 27th January, Shire was invited to join one of the weekly sessions, based at Lawrence Weston Community Farm. The morning session included a craft session, themed on Chinese New Year, including making origami fortune tellers and Chinese lanterns. There was a very stimulating group discussion, based on our knowledge of China and things Chinese. There were thrilling tales of members past adventures, travelling in China, Tibet and other parts of the Orient. There was a musical request session and more stimulating discussion about songs and bands, fondly remembered. When The Rolling Stones Little Red Rooster was requested. Group leader Naomi showed her youthfulness by admitting that she had never heard it before! As you can imagine, shock and horror, tinged with a little pity, rippled around the room. Naomi believes passionately in the power of singing as a therapy and a "joy bringer."

On Monday 10th February the Respite Group also held a **Valentine's Day Dance** which certainly brought warmth and cheer for a cold winter day as can be seen from the photos!

We also had the opportunity to chat to people individually and to hear their own stories:-

Carol worked for many years at the now demolished **Masons Arms** on Lawrence Weston Road. Several of the group knew Carol well from her time there. **Chris** told me that he has frontal lobe dementia, which means that, to an extent, he has "lost his filter", although his memory is sound. He is obviously happy to be known as the "group joker", puns and witty quips dripping from his lips at every opportunity. Chris is involved in work to further understand dementia, giving talks to NHS students about his experiences; some have visited him at home. He has also appeared on regional TV, to help further understanding of dementia. Chris said that he feels "part of him had died already" and as the disease progresses, "more bits die."

Peter has enjoyed a lifetime's love of football and cricket. He played for Leigh Town and Leigh-on-Sea Cricket Club, the latter based largely on the Essex Coast cockle industry. He worked in the City of London as a tea broker, for what he describes as a "great company". He obviously enjoyed his career and everything it provided, including a good pension. Peter's philosophy is: "Always remain positive and laugh a lot!" This is a good way to end, because Peter could have been summing up today's session in those seven words. There was fun, companionship, stimulation, care and love in abundance; the person masked by the disease is still there; they need our love and care more than anything else.

Shire JTE Hub - The One Stop Place To Be

The Shire JTE Hub is a community service that provides a whole range of activities and services including *Chatty Cafe, Games Nights, Job Club, to Financial Advice, the Community Fridge, craft activities* and more. It is based in the middle of Shirehampton's High Street at the local Methodist Church.

Darren Moore is the Hub Project Co-ordinator: "When I first started it was meant to be jobs training and enterprise but on my second day somebody came in and wanted to take their own life, I spent seven hours with them calling in the mental health crisis team. He's still alive, he realised there was somebody in his corner. After that things changed and there was wellbeing being offered, talking to people, spending a bit of time with them sort of building up their confidence a little bit."

"I have my own business and if someone has got an idea and they want to start their own business then that's my thing and I can really help them. I'm also a great believer in empowering people and that is why we have expanded on things and brought in other organisations such as **CleanSlate** who provide **debt**



advice and **maximise income**. We try to appeal to a lot of people".

"With the community fridge, it's all about reducing food waste. We don't want anybody to come in feeling like they're a burden or they're not entitled to it because they are. We don't need people to explain why they need food"

Kirsty Moore is a volunteer at the JTE Hub and is Darren's wife: "I've been a volunteer here for about two and a half years. I help allocate surplus food to people, giving them what they need and chatting with them,. Sometimes they'll open up on little things like, they are struggling a bit, so I steer them maybe to CleanSlate who are here on a Monday. We had one gentleman saying he was ultra lonely so I suggested to him the Chatty Cafe and Games Night on Tuesdays. We welcome everybody and anybody to the JTE Hub."

Kirsty helps out each day and she also has a talent for crafting: "If there's an easy way out of doing anything it's crafting, I'm there. I try and do sessions here during school holidays and we do advertise it. Personally, I make soap and lip balm and I can crochet a little."

The JTE Hub certainly has plenty to offer the local community, helping people reach their full potential in education, enterprise and employment, and plenty more besides. It is a welcoming place with plenty





of teamwork behind the scenes and they would love some more volunteers to help.

It is open Monday to Thursday from 9am until 4pm at the Methodist Church, Penpole Avenue, Shirehampton, Bristol, BS11 0DY.

Bristol Youth Voice Conference 2024

"The Power of Participation is to be wondered at."

The Bristol City Youth Council is a group of 29 young people, elected to represent Bristol's youth as follows:

- 18 young people are voted in through the Bristol Youth Elections where they stand for election within their school/ youth organisation
- 5 young people are elected through equality youth voice groups
- 6 young people are elected through their local areas.

The aim of the **Bristol City Youth Council** is to represent the voices of young people in Bristol and to campaign on their behalf. To find out the views of Bristol City Youth Council, 3 area youth forums a year are held in 3 areas of Bristol and end the year with a Youth Voice Conference.

Bristol's Youth Voice Conference 2024 was held at City Hall on Wednesday 6th November. The aim of the conference was for young people from across Bristol to come together to discuss the 4 themes identified from the Area Youth Forums. These were:

Communities: A sense of belonging or not belonging in their community, parks and spaces for young people, fly tipping and littering, anti-social behaviour, parking/speeding, schools and special educational needs and disabilities referrals.

Youth Services: Support for young people in school and outside, things to do that are free or low cost, along with safe spaces, more youth spaces and sessions.

Safety: Women's safety, online safety, areas where young people don't feel safe, lighting and policing.

Knife Crime: Witnessing other young people with knives, feeling unsafe, policing, recent tragedies affecting young people.

Our local delegates from **Lawrence Weston** were positive about there being something to do for all ages, having a safe place to go with friends and having a community food pantry. However, they also said that they feel unsafe in the area due to intimidating people, including drug users. There were worries about littering and rubbish, including needle usage in play areas. Young people feel there are not enough green spaces. Another concern was poor-quality housing. They would also like to see the rebuilding of parks and play areas. Young people also voted on their top priority for North which is Safety.

At the latest **North Area Youth Forum** in February, local young people came to Lawrence Weston youth centre to discuss issues affecting them including their priority of safety including solutions to make young people feel safer.

The next Area Youth Forum will be held on Wednesday 11th June 2025. Location TBC

Well, apparently the **French government** is issuing advice on how frequently we should wash our clothes. This is a good example of adaptation. We can use our expensive electricity and our dwindling water resources in more economical and environmentally thoughtful ways. Wash our underwear every day, but our jeans once a month. It won't stop climate change but it may limit overshoot.

One of the most accessible ways of seeing my work is via my Facebook page, "Shelley Anne Eynon – Artist".







Shirehampton Sailing Club is Opening Soon for Business!

Fancy sailing, rowing or paddling from right on your doorstep?

Shirehampton is on the tidal part of the Avon, between the Avon Gorge and the Severn. We are proud custodians of the cobbled slip that used to be the site of the Pill Ferry. We have a small but cosy clubhouse, a locked dinghy park and a grassy area where hold our events such as Try Sailing and the annual Pirate Party.

As the river is tidal, we only sail around high tide, launching anytime from two hours before high tide to two hours after high tide. When the tide is in the morning, we usually plan a breakfast canoe trip, setting off around 8am, usually reaching the **Suspension Bridge** an hour or so later at high tide, and turning back when the tide turns. This is quite a treat, as you see a lot of wildlife and the river is particularly beautiful early in the morning with the mist.

We also now have two gig rowing boats which we use when the tide is at a more civilised hour, and as the exercise keeps you warm, we are rowing in the spring – contact us now if you want to get involved.

Sailing happens when the tide is midday, so we have plenty of time to get ready – we have to launch our safety boat to rescue us when the wind is too much (making sailing boats capsize!) or when we run out of wind so the tide is sweeping us out to sea. We generally sail downriver towards **Avonmouth** as the wind is better there, and generally get as far as the M5 motorway bridge. This might turn into an informal friendly race, but mostly we just like to be on the water, taking guests out for the first time sailing, and soaking in our happy place.

Sometimes we sail up to the **Bristol Harbour** or out onto the Severn to meet up with our friends at **Portishead Yacht and Sailing Club**. A highlight of the year is the only race we have – partaking in the annual **Pill Race** that starts at Portishead and comes up the Avon, round a buoy in the river and back down to Portishead.

We don't employ anyone but do all the jobs between us, calling on practical and organisational skills, including messing about with the safety boat engine and electric winch. We're a friendly bunch and enjoy each other's company, going to the Lamps after water sessions and meeting once a month on a Monday evening to plan the next two months' activities.
